All funeral directors are legally required to publish this price list for a standardised set of products and services. This is to help you think through your options and make choices, and to let you compare prices between different funeral directors (because prices can vary)

Attended Funeral (Funeral Directors Charges Only)

in a hearse or other appropriate vehicle.

This is a funeral where family and friends have a ceremony, event or service for the deceased person at the same time as they attend their burial or cremation.

Unattended Funeral.

This is a funeral where family and friends may choose to have a ceremony or service for the deceased, but do not wish to attend the burial or cremation.

_	Cremation – (Funeral Directors Fees Plus Cremation Fee)	£1,430.00

Fees You Must Pay.

For an Attended or unattended burial, funeral the **burial fee** 1

In this local area, the typical cost of the burial fee for local residents is:

£350.00

For a new grave, you will also need to pay for the plot, for an existing grave with a memorial in place you may need to pay a removal fee. In addition, the cemetery may charge other fees.

For an Attended cremation funeral, the **cremation fee**. 2

In this local area, the typical cost of a cremation for a local resident is:

£766.00 - £1070.00

Additional Funeral Director Products and Services.

The funeral director may be able to supply a range of optional, additional products and services, or to arrange (on your behalf) for a third party to supply them. Examples Include-

The funeral director can give you a full list of what they can supply. They are likely to charge for these additional products and services so you may choose to take care of some arrangements without their involvement, or you can use a different supplier.

¹ This fee (which is sometimes called the interment fee) is the charge made for the digging and closing a new grave, or for reopening and closing an existing grave.

² In England, Wales and Northern Ireland, you will usually need to pay doctor's fees as well. This is the charge for two doctors to sign the Medical Certificate for Cremation.
